Active Managerial Control The Conversation Continues by Ron Campbell, Senior Environmental Health Specialist

In January, I was privileged to speak at the NCAEHA Winter Conference on the topic of active managerial control (AMC). The presentation revolved around how Fairfax County Health Department was raising the awareness of operators to the AMC concept through a recognition program. There were many questions about the recognition program and how we were implementing it. There was one particular question that I heard, not at the group level, that I thought was important to address. NCAEHA has been gracious to allow me to continue the AMC conversation in their current newsletter.

The issue that was raised was that certain types of restaurants – ethnic "mom

and pop" places, for exam-

ple – would not be conducive to the recognition program. I don't disagree. If that food service establishment has existing food safety issues, it probably would not be eligible for recogni-

tion. However, the bigger picture is this – we (food safety inspectors) have been suggesting various uses of active managerial control to gain compliance, without calling it active managerial control, for quite a long time. As much as we will raise awareness of the concept of AMC for food service operators in Fairfax County, we are also raising the awareness within our own staff of how to offer AMC as

it active managerial control! When we
ask someone to
use a temperature log for
their food along
the prep top,
why not frame
that in the con-

text of active managerial control? Even the "mom and pop" can benefit from using a temperature log if the situation warrants it. One very interesting comment that I heard at the Winter Conference was from a gentleman who was very familiar with active managerial control. He said that his company explains it as a means of "sharing responsibility." In its purest form, perhaps that is what active



managerial control really
is. The owner/manager is
training staff to be responsible for certain food safety
policies and has a verification and corrective action
process in place which may
allow him to rely on staff to
be completely responsible
for a particular risk factor
intervention. Again, I would
suggest that even a "mom
and pop" could benefit from
some "shared responsibil-

ity." That is just a good business practice. Can we frame it that way?

So, while much was made of the recognition program in Fairfax County, a side benefit to the food safety program is that we have brought to the fore another tool for staff to use to gain compliance. While there may not be many food service facilities being recognized initially, it is only logi-

cal that staff would take any opportunity to offer AMC as a means of addressing a compliance issue. The recognition award can be used as a carrot for the food service operator, but the

bigger reward is that through AMC an outof-compliance issue has been addressed and the EHS may not have to address the issue again in the future. Active managerial control is a useful tool and will work whether it is tied to a recognition program or not. I hope you will continue the AMC conversation in your own jurisdiction.
